With a few exceptions, you have the right to request and be informed about the information that the Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) releases. You are entitled to receive and review the information upon request. You also have the right to ask HHSC to correct information that is determined to be incorrect (Government Code, Sections 552.021, 552.023, 559.004).
